LCI Seeks Legal Protection

I hope Lions members of District 13-B have read the February Lions Magazine. There is an article on page 51 about a bill in Congress that protects the members of LCI.

The article talks about a bill, then President Clinton signed in 1997, the Volunteer Protection Act. This act provides immunity from tort claims that might be against the members of nonprofit organizations. The act did not cover the nonprofit organizations. Since this law does not cover the nonprofit organizations they are wide open to claims that could bankrupt all nonprofits.

LCI recognized the need to protect Lions Club and volunteer organizations in the US. LCI talked to Congressman Steve Chabot of Ohio and Senator Mark Kirk of Illinois to see if they could correct the problem and amend the 1997 bill. Congress last year introduced the Volunteer Organization Act of 2015, (VOPA).

LCI led the way for this bill to get introduced in Congress. The bill, if passed will cover all volunteers and all nonprofits. For more information visit LCI's online advocacy page for additional resources about VOPA.
