LOCAL LIONS CLUBS RECEIVE GRANT FROM LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL

The Ohio Lions District 13-B has been awarded a \$75,000 grant from the Lions Clubs International Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Lions Clubs International, to equip a new Vision Clinic at Lorain County Health & Dentistry's new facility in downtown Lorain. This is the largest allowable grant under the guidelines of the foundation.

This project represents a collaboration between Lions and Lorain County Health & Dentistry (LCH&D). Once the equipment is in place in September, 2013, LCH&D will staff and operate the full-time Vision Clinic. LCH&D also covered the build-out costs of the 1,000 square foot clinical area which will be located on the first floor of the Health Center's new facility at 1205 Broadway in Lorain. LCH&D is the largest safety-net provider of primary medical and dental care to insured and uninsured persons of all ages in Lorain County. Fees are discounted for uninsured patients who qualify. In the new facility, in addition to vision/eye care, LCH&D will offer pediatrics, OB/women's health, adult/family medicine, dentistry and asthma/allergy care. LCH&D serves those from within Lorain County and well beyond; there is no residency requirement to receive health care at LCH&D. Upon hearing the news that the Vision Clinic would be receiving the grant, District 13-B 2nd Vice District Governor Jeff Hillis said "I am very glad to see LCIF recognizing the value of our project in providing vision care for the economically disadvantaged in North Central Ohio." District 13-B comprises ten counties, including Ashland, Crawford, Erie, Huron, Lorain, Ottawa, Richland, Sandusky, Seneca, and Wyandot in north central Ohio.

"This project has received broad support from Lions Clubs in our district," Lorain Lions Club Past President and Vision Clinic Committee Chairman Ken Cromer stated. "A project of this nature requires the help of many people and we have had a very hard-working committee of 30 Lions from around north central Ohio involved." Currently, Lions clubs are working together to raise \$254,000 to purchase the clinical equipment needed for the Vision Clinic at LCH&D. Dr. John R. Smith, OD, a Lorain Lions Club member and co-chair of the Vision Clinic Committee, notes that, "I know many optometrists who struggle to find a place to refer patients with no ability to pay for ongoing eye care needs. This clinic will be able to help so many people with their vision and medical eye conditions. It is important for every person and business that can help, to help in some way."

"This project is one of many that exemplify the motto of Lions 'We Serve.' When the clinic becomes a reality, the uninsured and underinsured residents of the District will have a clinic that can care for them when the need arises," said John Donley, District 13-B LCIF Chairman.

"The Lions-Lorain County Health & Dentistry collaboration is a win-win for our organizations and the broader community," said Stephanie Wiersma, LCH&D President & CEO. "While the project isn't completed just yet, we know that very soon it will be, and, as a result, very soon we will be extending our reach into the community offering a new health service to the most vulnerable in north central Ohio. It has been a true honor and pleasure to work with Lorain and District 13B Lions over the past two years to plan the Vision Clinic and make it a reality. I can't think of a better, more effective or more rewarding collaboration," Wiersma noted.

In addition to the LCIF grant, the project has received financial support from Lions around the District, local businesses, and individual community members. Other grants have also been received from local foundations, including a \$25,000 general grant and a \$25,000 matching grant from the Nord Family Foundation. "It has been energizing to see the support of so many individuals and organizations to the project," Cromer said. "The Nord Family Foundation grant has been especially positive in getting more people involved."

The Vision Clinic at Lorain County Health & Dentistry will enable treatment for eye diseases and conditions and will provide routine eye exams and glasses. This collaboration between Lions and LCH&D strengthens the Lions motto 'We serve.'"

we charge. We should be checking with our customers to confirm they still want the calendar and if there are any changes.






