"Strengthen the Pride"

The 95th Annual Multiple District 13, Ohio Lions Convention is completed; and it was an eventful weekend in Dublin, Ohio.

The biggest news is that the amendment to the state constitution, which re-draws the districts in Ohio overwhelmingly, passed with a 91% majority. The District 13B caucus supported the passage of the amendment. Starting on July 1, 2016 Ohio will have seven districts instead of the current ten.

What will this new structure mean to all of us here in District 13B? Well the answer is that very little will change. Our district retains the same boundaries, and all current13B clubs will be in the new district. The thing that many of will have the most difficulty adjusting to is that we will no longer be called District 13B, but rather our new designation will be District 13OH-2.

13B was the only Ohio District whose boundaries were unaffected. The reason: we will have approximately the same number of members and clubs as the other six new districts.

In addition to the re-districting proposal; Ohio Lions Eye Research Foundation presented a rewritten, updated Code of Regulations (Constitution) during the foundation's annual meeting on Saturday for a vote. The new code was adopted unanimously. This new Code is a modernized version of the old document, and will bring the foundation's document in line with current practice.

The International Guest at the Convention was First Vice President Lion Joe Preston of Arizona. 1st VP Preston will be elected as President of the Association in Toronto in July. 1st VP Joe is an engaging and personable leader, who will do great things for us during this coming year. His theme for the coming year is, **"Strengthen the Pride"**, and that will be our theme here in 13B.

A few personal notes:

Longtime Bloomville Lions Secretary Dave Zartman is under the weather. Lion Dave has served his club and District 13B in many capacities, and I am sure he would enjoy receiving a card or a note while he recovers.

The District 13B PDG Association is sponsoring their All Charity Golf Tournament at Woody Ridge on June 22. Why don't you get together a team and have some fun? Anyone is welcome to play, so this would be a good way to introduce your friends and family to Lions.

Finally, on behalf of all the Lions of District 13B; allow me to thank District Governor Francis Hensel for his great year. DG Francis has served with particular distinction. He has been shown us that he has the "Heart of a Lion". Well done, District Governor! We thank you, and we are grateful that you served!




