

Hotel Reservations

Room reservations prior to November 30, 2013 may be made by requesting the Ohio Lions group rate of \$75.00/night plus tax <u>with 1 to 4 persons per room</u>. After November 30th the room rate <u>may</u> increase. The State Office will not accept hotel reservations or room deposits.

Camp Echoing Hills served 28 children during Lions Children's week and 57 teens during Lions Teen Week. Total attendance of our seven weeks of camp was 367. averaging about 52 campers per week. We also served more than 150 individuals throughout the state through our Camp in Motion program. The total number of campers served this summer was over 520.

The Lions Clubs of Ohio generously donated \$40,185.62 toward Lions Camperships. The amount of campership dollars awarded for the summer was \$33,165. We gave a total of 65 camperships, including 18 designated camperships and 47 camperships with undesignated Lions funds. In addition, we used \$250 for families who could not afford to pay the application fee of \$50. The total amount of Lions money awarded for the 2013 summer was \$33,415. Out of the remaining \$6,770.62, Camp Echoing Hills would like to designate \$5,000 to provide Lions camperships to Respite campers and \$250 for Lions camp participation fees.

Lions Youth Camps

The theme for the 2013 Ohio Lions Youth Camp was Restoration. Together, campers and staff celebrated how God restores broken lives and relationships and delights in giving purpose to the 'unusable.' Campers explored the theme of recycling and how items that at first glance seem destined for the trash can be repurposed into something beautiful and useful.

Campers enjoyed daily activities such as go-cart rides, paintball, fishing, and visiting with the therapy llamas. They participated in a number of events such as the Talent Show, Kangaroo Court, and the Luau. During evening services, campers were blessed through music, drama, and many great speakers.
