PDG Francis Hensel asked each club to consider a donation to the Ohio Lions Club Band so they can perform for the 100 year celebration.

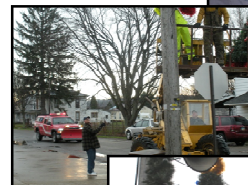

### Tiffin

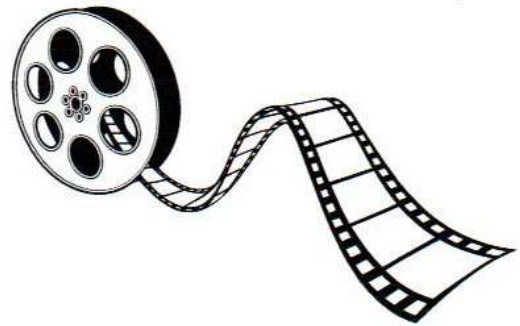
