Perrysville Lions will place an ad in the Hillsdale Follies program for \$20.00 to advertise the Car Show and the Ice cream social.

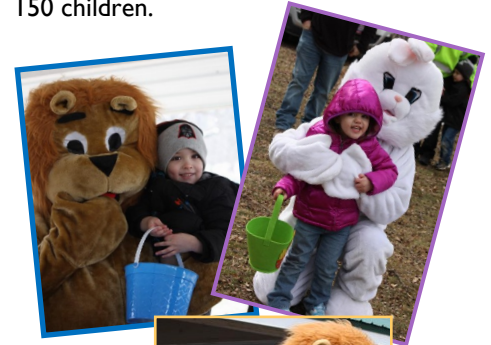
The proceeds from the April meal will go to the Support the Troops and the May proceeds will go to Helping Hand.
