## Fiftieth Anniversary

PDG Lion Ray Miller, Sr.--50 years of dedicated and unselfish service to the Ashland County community.



Past District Governor (PDG) Ray Miller, Sr. was a member of the Ashland Fire Department for 30 plus years, serving as Assistant Chief for the ten years prior to his retirement in 1990. In the 1970's he was part of the first class of paramedics trained in the State of Ohio. For 25 years he taught firefighting and emergency squad techniques as a Trade & Industrial instructor through Ohio State University. Following retirement, he was involved in the real estate business for over 20 years.

He joined the Ashland Evening Lions in May 1967 and has an unbroken record of perfect attendance. He was a 100% President in 1977-78; served as a 100% District Governor for then District 13B in 1992-93; and served a second term as club president in 2014-2015. Miller holds a Senior Master Key for having sponsored more than 25 new Lions. He has received multiple International Presidents' Appreciation and Lions Clubs International Awards and is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow. He served as Zone 7 Chairman 1987-90 and then finished the year 2005-2006 upon the untimely death of Lion Jim Crawford. Miller was MD13 Extension Chairman from 1993-94 through 1997-98. He then served on the MD13 Leadership Development Committee from 1998-99 through 2003-2004 and was Committee Chairman for the last four years. He attended two LCI Leadership Institutes in Oak Brook, Illinois, many International Conventions and USA/Canada Leadership Forums, as well as District and State Conventions.

At the club level, Miller has served on most club committees and chaired many of them including the Parade Committee

and Santa House for many years, and was involved in the club's major fundraising effort to replace the seats at the Bandshell at Brookside Park. He was part of the group that brought Project Lifesaver International to Ashland County. Major health issues have curtailed his efforts in recent years, but he remains strongly committed both to Lions Clubs International and to the Ashland Evening Lions.

PDG Lion Ray and Lion Ann Miller have three grown children – Laura Bailey, Kathy Pfahler, and Ray Jr., and four grandsons who are the light of their lives.

## Outstanding Alumni Award

## **Districts and clubs will have the option to report their service activities in fiscal year 2018-19 using either MyLion for web or MyLCI**

### **Dear Lion Leaders and Officers,**

We received feedback from district and club officers about their challenges with the July 1, 2018 launch of MyLion as the new service activities reporting system. And we listened. We understand that clubs and districts need more time to prepare for this important transition. By giving clubs and districts the option to report through MyLion for web or through MyLCI in fiscal year 2018-19, we can:

Provide more time for training our club and district officers

Give officers at all levels more time to communicate with their members and clubs to ensure a successful transition to MyLion

Ensure that club and district officers have the time they need to test MyLion so they can use it with confidence

We are still planning to release MyLion for web on July 1, 2018. We encourage everyone who is ready to use MyLion web to begin using it next year, but MyLCI can still be used for service activity reporting throughout the coming year. We will be combining service activity reports for both systems so that reports will be accurate no matter which platform you or your Lions are using.

Innovations like the new MyLion for web reporting system are important to the present and future of Lions. It also takes time, training and communication to make sure innovative technologies like MyLion work most effectively for our clubs and districts.

To better support you, we will send out more information including FAQs and training schedules in the coming days. We look forward to working with you over the coming year to prepare all clubs and districts for a successful transition to MyLion for web in fiscal year 2019-20.

Thank you for your continued support and leadership in making your districts and clubs the top destinations for service-minded men and women around the world.

*10-Year Eyeglasses Recycling Partnership between Ashland Evening Lions Club and Goodwill Industries*

*In the past, Goodwill Industries was forced to discard any eyeglasses donated to them because they were not permitted to offer them for resale. Beginning in 2008, the Ashland Goodwill Store, along with others in their Akron District, have saved all donated prescription glasses, reading glasses, and sunglasses coming through their donation centers. The Ashland Evening Lions Club then picks up these eyeglasses, counts them, and forwards*

*them to VOSH for potential refurbishing and use for mission trips.*

*In the 2017-2018 Lions year just ended, we recycled 9512 pairs of glasses. During the life of the joint project, 42,708 pairs of eyeglasses were saved from the trash and forwarded to VOSH for potential reuse. This ongoing joint effort benefits the environment, the potential recipients, the Lions as a community service project, and Goodwill Industries as a responsible business.*

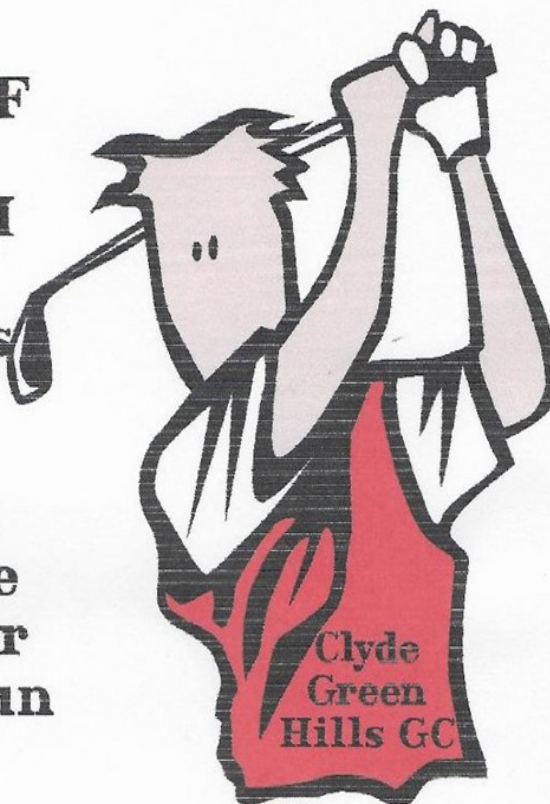

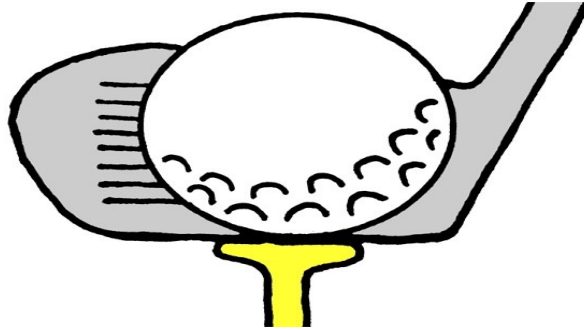

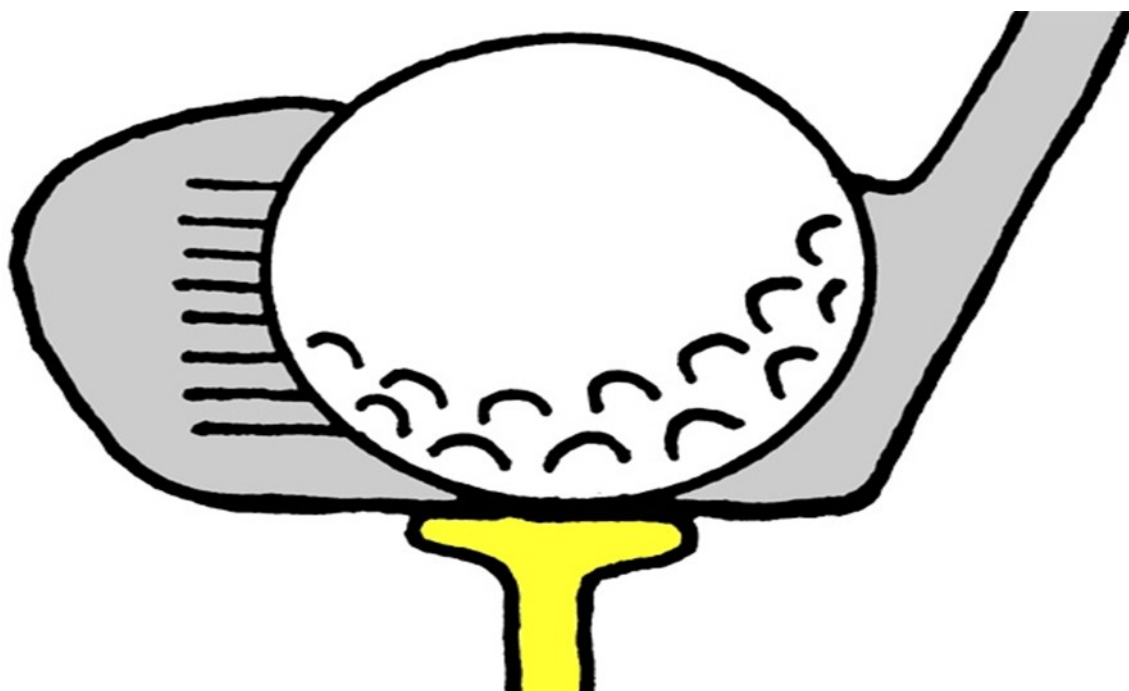
