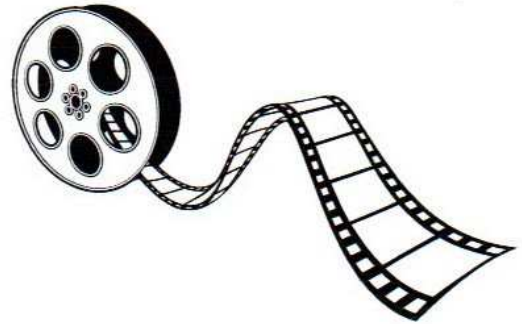

"1st VP Lion Walter Gilmore (R) conducted the March 5 meeting of the Ashland Evening Lions club. He introduced Carol Hale, local representative of "A Special Wish Foundation, Inc.," as the program speaker. The foundation provides special wishes to individuals from birth to 20 years-old with a life threatening disease, at no expense to the individual. Lion Norbert Peiker, Ashland Evening Lions, attended (by personal invitation) a reception on March 5, 2015 for retiring Dr. Lembach, the medical director of the Central Ohio Lions Eye Bank (COLEB).

Lion Peiker served on COLEB's Operating Board for six year, the most years that a trustee can serve. During those years he worked closely with Dr. Lembach and was asked to lead COLEB in the search for new quarters. The COLEB laboratory and offices were on the verge of no longer receiving the maximum accreditation years due to substandard space provided by OSU. An invitation came forth from the Arena Eye Center, still in the planning stage at the time, to buy into the Center. Lion Peiker spoke with the Eye Bank's Lions Board and with combined efforts they raised \$60,000 for the required down payment. Lion Peiker also was commissioned, pro bono, to design the COLEB suite including the laboratory. He negotiated the move with Dr. Paul Weber of OSU-Ophthalmology to avoid a potential rift between OSU and COLEB. The Eye Bank honored Lion Peiker with a Lifetime Achievement Award.

Ashland Noon Lions President Ollie Highman presents a check from the club to be

used towards the new Cheyenne Spidel memorial pavilion at the Ashland county fairgrounds, to her mother Stacey Koch and grandfather PCC Stan Kopp. Cheyenne was active in many fair activities including 4-H and FFA, and tragically lost her life in an automobile accident last year. Thanks to the Lions and other community support, the new entertainment pavilion will be a big addition to the fairgrounds promoting local talent, and a reminder of the contributions Cheyenne made to the community.

At a recent board meeting, the board approved the expenditure of \$1200 for our annual donation to the state of Ohio projects sponsored by the Ohio Lions, namely LCIF (Lions Club International Foundation), Eye Research, Sight and Hearing, and Diabetes and Hearing and Speech.

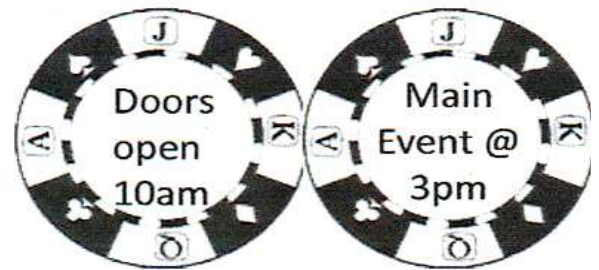

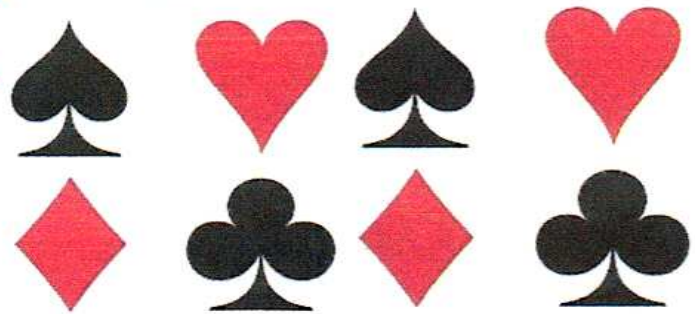

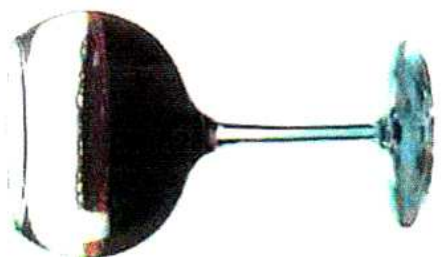
