Global Service "Snippets"

The Global Service Focus for February is International Childhood Cancer Did you know???????
*Every 2 minutes a child is diagnosed with cancer.
*There has been a 13% increase in incidences of childhood cancer over the last 20 years.

*6 is the average age of a child diagnosed with cancer. *90% of childhood cancer deaths occur in low resource settings.

As Lions Clubs, our strategic objective is to "Help those affected by childhood cancer survive and thrive." The stress that impacts families dealing with the diagnosis of childhood cancer is overwhelming; Lions Clubs can assist families by planning projects that support family needs at this time. One of the first helps Lions Clubs can "do" is have a conversation with the family members regarding their most urgent needs. If transportation cost is a priority, Lions Clubs might provide gas cards over a period of time (not just "one and done"). If transportation is needed, plan a car pool schedule for appointments or after school pickup. Pooling resources with other organizations can provide the most seamless plan and impact. Another need might be a hot meal prepared for the family members left at home. Clubs could partner with other organizations/groups to provide a nutritional meal on a regular schedule. Your Club's help will be appreciated by those in need.

Book Review

If you are a leader who relies on telling people you are the president or you are their boss to get them to act, then you are at Level One in the Five Levels of Leadership. Level One or the level of Position is the bottom of all leadership levels in John C. Maxwell's guide to be a leader that people want to follow. At level one people Have To follow you. This doesn't encourage progress, new ideas, or efficacy. People just do what they are told, often with reservations or distrust. This is a level that leaders do not want to remain at if they want long term success.

Level Two is the Level of Permission and of Relationships. People follow you because they believe in you, they trust you and want to follow you.


Level Three is the Level of Production or of Results. People follow because you deliver. You have accomplished things within the company or organization.

Level Four is a Level of People Development. People follow you because of what you have done for them. You have helped them to become leaders themselves. You have shared your knowledge with them, and they follow because they appreciate you. For most people this is the peak of their progression, very few make it to level Five.

Level Five is the level of Personhood. People follow because of who you are, what you represent, and because of your values. This is the level of leaders that have developed many other leaders over many years. These leaders are larger than life!

I recommend that you check out The Five Levels of Leadership by John C. Maxwell.

Every person whether a low-level manager to the owner of a company can learn how to step up their effectiveness.
