As well, watch the update requirements for club incorporations and sales tax filings. Nearly all our clubs now use MYLION to report their service. It has not been easy, but you meet the challenge of figuring out this new system. If your club is changing Secretaries or Administrators, please help them get comfortable with the system so we can transition without interruption of reporting.

Of course, the big challenge on everyone's mind is Covid-19, and what it means for our ability to serve. This pandemic has caused the cancellation of conventions, projects, fundraisers, and keeps forcing us to put off trainings. The key to dealing with all of this is our ability to adapt. If we insist that our projects operate like they always have, then most likely that project will not continue. If we change our approach, we can find ways to be successful. Instead of a sit-down meal, many clubs have switched to drive through pick up meals for instance. Many clubs have put a focus on providing card showers for those shut in at nursing homes. Need has not ended and in fact has multiplied in this time and we need to find ways to safely serve.

Unfortunately, we will not be able to have our officer training on June 20th. DGE Kerry, the Global Leadership Team and I are working together to come up with option. Most likely it will be held in an online format. If you are an officer for the coming year, please make every effort to participate in what ever is developed. Now more then ever, being fully informed is particularly important.

Since I will not be able to properly recognize all the great Lions of the district that have earned awards this year, I am including the winners in this newsletter. We will work to get your awards in your hands as soon as possible; however, it may be that we distribute them at the first round of Zone Meetings. I wish I could have properly recognized the individuals that contributed so much to our district this year and properly thanked them for their help and commitment.

If you have not gotten your clubs weight loss challenge forms and donations turned in, I need those ASAP. Make checks to Ohio Lions District OH2 and put Weight Loss Challenge in the memo. Because of the many cancellations, we have reduced the requirements from eight to six to qualify for the Club Secretary award. Presidents please get them to me. **If you have silent auction items, I guess there is always next year's convention.**

It has been a tremendous honor to serve you and this district as Governor this year. Some of it did not go as planned, but that is all part of being in a position of leadership. You do not always get to decide the challenges. I am excited about the future of our district and I know you will support DGE Kerry and then Lion Kevin and Lion Cindy as they become Governors in the following years.

To our club leaders, if you have not already heard, our Leadership Training scheduled for June 20 has had to be cancelled; the church is not permitting any non-church events until after July 1. We feel that it is important to offer training for our club officers before the new year starts – to understand the responsibilities of the office and set goals for your club for next year. In promoting good club leadership, we also want to roll out a **President's Challenge and a Secretary's Challenge for next year**. Club presidents, secretaries, treasurers, membership chairmen, and public relations chairmen will receive a packet in the mail with any handouts that would be distributed at Leadership Training. Then, we will host an online session for each of the officers. The schedule is:

Each session should be 45-60 minutes. At this time, there will not be an online Tail Twister Training. MyLion Training is scheduled for after July 1 so that your MyLCI accounts should be activated by that time. The trainings are spread across several dates to invite club presidents and vice presidents to attend other trainings for any office they have not served in and to better work with the members of your officer team. It is not mandatory for presidents to attend all sessions, but rather an open invitation to better understand the roles in your club. All the links to these meetings will be emailed and mailed out to these officers.

For our incoming officers that are not internet/online friendly, you will be receiving your packets in the mail. You are welcome to call in to the Zoom trainings from a traditional phone if you want to participate that way. The meeting host (to be specified in your packet) can give you the call-in information. You are also welcome to call or contact DG Kenny, VDG Kevin, VDG Cindy or myself as well as some of the presenters to get updated on the points from your training session. Our contact information will be in your packets.

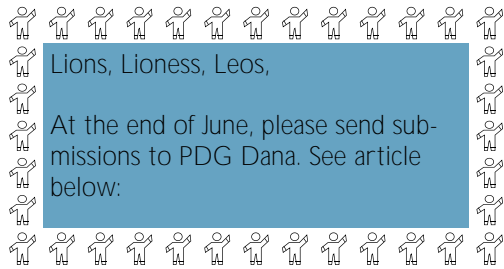
