Words from the Governor

Lions, we are off to the start of a very unique year. In the last few weeks, clubs have finally begun to meet again and to look for coronavirus-safe solutions to serving and fundraising. I want to extend a heart-felt thank-you to the Lions who served in 2019-2020. All the ways you worked to keep your club active and your club members safe and healthy during the coronavirus shutdown are a special part of the success of your year.

Congratulations to all of the incoming 2020-2021 officers! Thank-you to everyone who participated in the Zoom trainings or contacted me to get the information. We had over 120 Lions attend the four sessions. I hope to have the majority of club presidents and secretaries online for the MyLion and MyLCI Reporting Training on July 6th.

Now is the time to set goals for your club — what impact will you have? More than ever, our communities are in need of our service and ways to build connectedness. Our challenge is not just to meet these service needs, but to grow in the process. To build a climate where members look forward to club fellowship and feel satisfied in service well-done.

My theme for this year is *Think Globally, Act Locally*. Our motto is WE SERVE and in every facet of this year, I will push service to our local communities. *Act Locally*. Service is a member satisfaction tool but it also defines our organization. How does your community perceive the Lions? What do they see you doing? What about our service can draw them to want to serve with us? *Think Globally* is our mindset. While our hands serve the immediate needs of our communities, what are we doing to better the future? As Lions, our impact goes beyond the here and now; we have the ability to invest in the future. This may be donations to sponsor research for vision, diabetes or childhood cancer. It may be going into our schools or after school groups to educate and encourage healthy lifestyles, civic duty or recycling. It may be vision screenings to catch eye issues in three and four year-olds to get them corrective treatments. As you plan the year ahead, how are you serving both *locally* and *globally*?

To this end, I have three goals for our clubs to aim for. These goals will be printed in the front of this year's directory – thank-you Lion Dan! – so that clubs have a reference point all year.

1. By the end of the 2020-2021 Lions year, 13 OH2 clubs will complete the "Blueprint for a Stronger Club" (for club growth and retention) Club presidents, your challenge is to complete the Blueprint for a Stronger Club with your membership and community. Based on the results of the surveys, set at least two goals aimed at improving or strengthening your club. I look forward to talking with you about your findings as I come around on my club visits.

 80% of clubs in our district will report service activities in at least 3 of the 5 areas of global service by March 1, 2021.

> Club secretaries and service chairpersons, your challenge is to aim for a service project or donation in all five of our global causes – *vision, hunger* environment, diabetes awareness, and childhood cancer. The club will earn a patch for completing three projects; the secretary will earn a Secretaries Challenge pin for reporting all five projects. Club members can step up and help the secretary report too! Check out the MyLion session on July 6th to find out how.

3. By June 15, 2021, all 13 OH2 clubs will support LCIF's Campaign 100 through donations of at least \$250, either from the club or from individual members, or both. Club treasurers and directors, this may be the most challenging goal. Some clubs give this easily, some have to work harder to make the donation, especially with the

coronavirus affecting our fundraising. But as of June 25, 2020, LCIF awarded us \$10,000 in an emergency grant to provide testing and PPE for the areas of our district hardest hit by the coronavirus. We have **Community Impact Grants** that we can apply for and we have clubs organizing to use these funds. This is our foundation. It is one of the ways that we can think forward and make that global impact.

If you are focusing on the what-ifs and unknowns of our current situation – let's work together to find solutions - to continue to grow our service and increase our impact. It may take some "out-of-the-box" thinking, but we can do it. Our zone chairs, district officers, cabinet, and fellow clubs are great resources when we feel stuck.

I look forward to the challenge of this year, because I know that I am working with a phenomenal group of leaders and club members that have always given me their very best. There is no question of our success if we set our sights and move forward together.

Living Well with Diabetes

July 2020

Welcome to our Global Cause – Diabetes

Over the course of this Lions year, we are going to feature information and tips for living with diabetes. In 2017, Lions Club International partnered with the International Diabetes Federation, to bring the hands and resources of its members to help with what is snowballing into a diabetes

epidemic. More and more, we have children adapting to life with type 1 and type 2 diabetes, and adults at every age coping with the damage and danger of it. As Lions, we want to learn to live better with diabetes – for ourselves and for our family members. And we also want to do what we can to reverse the growing trend of this disease, so that our children, grandchildren and our communities can live better.

So, some facts to kick this off. Did you know that:

- More than 34 million people in the United States have diabetes, and 1 in 5 of them don't know they have it.
- More than 88 million US adults (out of 308 million) nearly 30% have <u>prediabetes</u>, and more than 80% of them don't know they have it.

- Diabetes is the 7th leading cause of death in the United States (and may be underreported).
- Type 2 diabetes accounts for approximately 90% to 95% of all diagnosed cases of diabetes; type 1 diabetes accounts for approximately 5-10%.
- Globally, the number of people with diabetes has risen from 108 million in 1980 to 422 million in 2014 – an increase of nearly 300%. In

- the US alone, our percentage has doubled since 2000.
- Diabetes prevalence has been rising more rapidly in middleand low-income countries.
- Diabetes is a major cause of blindness, kidney failure, heart attacks, stroke and lower limb amputation.
- Globally, in 2016, an estimated 1.6 million deaths were directly caused by diabetes. Another 2.2 million deaths were attributable to high blood glucose.

Crawford County Low Vision Project

The Crawford County Low Vision Project provided help to a resident of Galion who went blind recently. He was referred to the National Foundation of the Blind. They have an application under Products and Services on their website for obtaining a free white cane. There is

information on measuring for the size of the cane and also information on how to use a white cane.

In January of 2019 it became possible to get a white cane through Medicaid also as durable medical equipment.

There is information on-line for using a white cane but since neither this man nor his caregiver have Internet access, a printout of information was mailed to his caregiver. If he is able to travel for training later, he could obtain training at the Cleveland Sight Center.

People residing in counties on the

northwest side of our district can obtain help at the Sight Center of Northwest Ohio.
