As we turn the page, thankfully, on 2020 and usher in a New Year, Ohio Lions have been challenged by our neighboring Lions to the west (Indiana) and the north (Michigan) to recruit new members and retain existing members to grow our Lions Clubs statewide. The **Tri State Membership Challenge** begins this month (January) through the end of March 2021. While this is a third quarter activity, I view the **Challenge** as an opportunity to move beyond the competition time and continue through the 2021-2022 Lions Year.

A Lions theme for membership some five years ago was: **"Strengthen the Pride"**. Now as we emerge from a worldwide pandemic, our Lions are emerging from, in some instances, a "forced hibernation". Other clubs have remained active with meetings and activities, held either virtually or in person with health precautions in place. Now is the time to Strengthen the Pride of Lions Clubs, beginning with your own club.

Brain Boost

Move your body and might benefit your brain. German researchers tracked 2,013 adults ages 21 to 84 over the course of about 15 years. They measured participants' exercise capacity and, using magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), analyzed their brains. Taking into account the participants' age, education, and overall health, the researchers found **the fittest participants also had the highest brain volume in regions of the brain that are linked to cognitive health.** Whether exercise leads directly to improved brain health remains an open question, but this study provides more evidence of the benefits of staying fit.

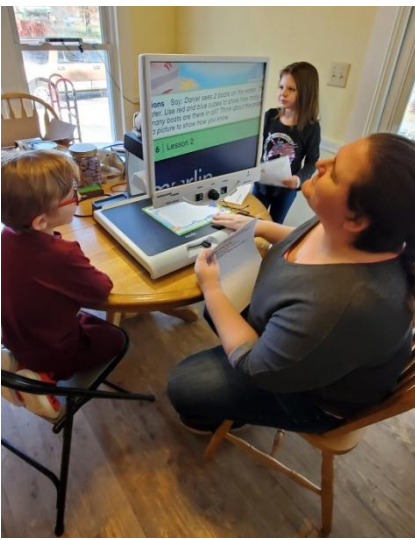
Club News Past, Present and to Come

Ashland Evening Lions

The Ashland Evening Lions reopens the world for Candice Regal, daughter of Past District Governor Pastor Gary and Sandy West. The donation of an Optical Scanner reopens the world for Candice so she can read books, documents and other printed material and assist her children Aren, Peyton, and Ethan with their school work. Candice grew up understanding the generosity of the Lions with her father being a Member of the Medina Lions Club and serving as District Governor in 1993 - 1994. She also understood the challenges of the blind with her father losing his eyesight in 1978 and becoming totally blind. Candice was born with severe myopia. She grew up facing the challenge of being fitted correctly with corrective lenses and wearing contact

lenses from the age of 5. All her life her Ophthalmologist was checking into new procedures to better correct her vision. Several years ago she started to develop cataracts in both eyes. In November of 2019 she had cataract surgery in both eyes that gave her 20/25 vision. It was a great time for Candice but unfortunately the retina in her left eye became detached in August of 2020 and she lost her vision in her left eye. She has had 3 surgeries now to attempt to properly reattach the retina in her left eye. As of now she has no vision or light perception in the left eye. The Doctor does not give her any hope of the vision returning in that eye. Candice is now trying to adjust to life with being blind in one eye. She will face many challenges in her future. But, the gift of the Optical Reader will help her overcome some of

those challenges. Candice and her husband, Don, are Charter Members of the Newly Formed Wellington United Lions Club. They are looking forward to serving their community and giving hope to others in need as hope has been given to her through the generosity of the Ashland Evening Lions Club. 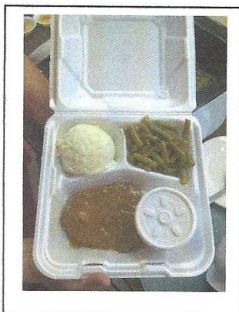
