# Living Well *with Diabetes*

## **The Power of Resistance: *Bone Strength***

Compared with people who don't have diabetes, those with type 1 are at higher risk for developing osteoporosis (a disease in which bones become weak or brittle), while those with type 2 have a greater risk for fractures, according to the International Osteoporosis Foundation. Resistance training helps build stronger bones by putting stress on them, which stimulates bone cells to grow.

## **The Power of Resistance: *Mood***

Strength training can also lift your spirits. A review of 33 studies – including three that focused on people with type 2 – published in 2018 in *JAMA Psychiatry* found that regular strength-training sessions reduced symptoms of depression. Researchers suspect that, just like aerobic exercise, strength training raises levels of feel-good brain hormones called endorphins.
