# Living Well with Diabetes

#### **Body of Water**

Both dehydration and overhydration can interfere with brain function in older adults. In a study, researchers used blood test data on 2,056 adults age 60 and older to determine how hydrated they were. Participants performed tasks to measure cognitive function. Among the women (but not the men) **dehydration was associated with lower scores on tasks measuring thinking speed, attention and memory**. It's not clear whether dehydration causes brain problems or whether people with brain problems drink less water. Meanwhile, 9 to 12 cups of water or other no-or low-sugar drinks per day are generally recommended for healthy women and men, respectively.

## **Zone Chair Reports**

Zone 7 Craig Wiley Zone Chair

Zone 7 is pleased to report that earlier this year we were awarded a \$1000 **LCIF District and Club Community Action Gran**t to benefit Savannah-Nankin Fire/EMT Exploring Post #7632. The post will use the funds to purchase helmets and safety gear and to raise awareness throughout Ashland County.

*Exploring* is an interactive, worksite-based career education program affiliated with the Boy Scouts of America, and according to Savannah-Nankin Lead Explorer Scott Engelhardt, the Post's advisers include past Boy Scouts, some of which were members of a similar post back in the 1980s and '90s affiliated with the Ashland City Fire Department.

Engelhardt initially contacted 1<sup>st</sup> Vice District Governor Kevin Reidy in the summer of 2020 to inquire about the possibility of financial support. The Lions of Zone 7 took up the request and ultimately moved at its November 2020 Governors Advisory Meeting to apply for an LCIF grant.

Zone Chair Craig Wiley wrote the grant application with assistance from Governor Kerry Parker and VDG Kevin Reidy. Wiley, a retired teacher who had previously written a couple school-related grants, noted the LCIF application was relatively brief and simple compared to most educational applications.

That doesn't mean however that there's less accountability once the grant is received. During the next few months the Explorer Post will keep detailed records of its expenses and activities under the guidance of a grant steering committee, and at the end of the project, Zone 7 is required to submit a final report. Publicity is also a stipulation and integral component, as it serves to promote both the Post and Lions Clubs International.

Governor Kerry and her mother PCC Sharon, 1<sup>st</sup> VDG Kevin, and ZC Craig were on-hand at the Post's April 13<sup>th</sup> meeting to present the check for \$1000 and meet with the steering committee. The committee includes Nankin/Orange Township Fire Department Chief Harry Myers and Savannah Volunteer Fire Company Chief Steve Dinsmore (a third-generation family member of the Savannah Lions Club).

# Club News Past, Present and to Come

### Amherst Steele Leo Club

The Amherst Steele Leo Club recently donated a Trex bench to the City of Amherst by way of their "Bags-to-Benches" project to reduce plastic waste. Participating in a community challenge program sponsored by Trex, manufacturer of composite decking and railing, the Amherst Leos collected over 500 pounds of used plastic film, such as grocery bags and product wrappings, which Trex recycles into their outdoor building products. A Trex made bench is donated for every 500 pounds of plastic film collected within a 6-month period.

Presenting the bench in the photo to Amherst Mayor Mark Costilow are: Leo President Eliza Stojkov, Vice President Sebastian Pecora, Secretary Camilla Isaacs, Treasurer Laken Voss, and Bags-to-Benches Chairperson, Erin Vontell. Mayor Costilow says the bench will be placed in City Hall for the public to use while waiting to visit him or other administration offices.

This is the second bench the Leos have earned over the past couple of years. The first was gifted to Amherst Steele High School.

Meanwhile, the Leos just finished in May gathering another 500 pounds of plastic film. The club members will decide at the beginning of next school year where to donate their third bench.
