Ohio District 13 OH2 Cabinet Report Monday, February 21, 2022

Kevin Reidy, District Governor

Cabinet Secretary Steve and fellow Lions,

Since the November Cabinet meeting, I have visited 15 clubs in district OH2. Two of the visits were to club branches, including the Butler Lioness Lions Club branch and the recently formed Crestline Noon Club branch.

During the visits, clubs are reminded to focus upon their service to their unique communities. The visibility of Lions within towns and villages can be paid forward with prospective new members and growth of clubs. LCI's \$35.00 new member administrative fee is waived through June 30, 2022.

Along with Lion Debbie, we participated in our inaugural Ohio Lions Winter Retreat, held at Maumee Bay State Park. Event co-chairs, Lion Julianne Zody and Lion Beth Cauley and their team provided a robust agenda of activities in which attendees could enjoy. Fun and fellowship were a constant during the weekend. Guiding Lions training was offered; I took advantage of the workshop for a three year certification.

During the retreat, I learned that OH2 is one of the top 10 districts, by percentage, for service logged through MyLion. District OH2 is within reach of attaining 100% MyLion Service reporting: EVERY CLUB will need to submit their service hours recorded on projects through MyLion. We Can Do This!

Lion Debbie and I also accompanied CC Kerry Parker, OH3 DG Deb Mosier and Lion Doc and OH4 DG Judy Young to Hopkinsville, KY to present a check to District 43K DG Gary Logan from Ohio Lions toward disaster relief on January 28-29. Donations throughout Ohio totaled \$23,881.91, of which over \$6,000.00 was donated from OH2. In the presence of IP Doug Alexander and Kentucky Lions from MD43, we also viewed the aftermath of the December 10 tornados in Dawson Springs, KY. It was the second time in my life that I had observed the ravages of nature's wrath: a humbling experience and one for which I am grateful to our organization, our district as well as LCIF donations to assist those in need.

On January 30, the GAT convened a zoom meeting. Zone Chairs, Region Chairs and the officer team discussed upcoming Zone advisory meeting reminders for clubs, reviewed deadlines for DG contests for excellence, humanitarian, and service. In addition, coordinators for leadership, membership and service updated the group and discussed items pertaining to future events.

District OH2 Convention forms were distributed via the district newsletter, website and state website, as well as to all club secretaries for completion and return to Convention Chair Marj Pond before March 1, 2022. Ads for the Convention program were also shared for purchase for club consideration. We are looking forward to a ROARING good time April 1-3, 2022. The next Cabinet meeting will be April 2, 2022.

1. An informative article from Legal Division was sent to be published in all district newsletters. It advises affected clubs **not** to opt-out of coverage in the BSA bankruptcy suit. If your club is contacted regarding litigation, contact LCI Legal directly and they will work with your club directly.
2. **A band for Boston 2023.** The Ohio State School for the Blind is looking forward to joining us for the parade at the International Convention in Boston, June 2023. There are details to be worked out to organize the logistics of this venture. Begin to encourage clubs to donate to the Band Fund for 2022-2023. The band director and I will be working on some PR for the district newsletters to encourage clubs to support these students.
3. **Continued state service project.** The Global Service Team is working to coordinate a *collection phase* to help the disaster areas in Western Kentucky. We are hoping for 100% participation from the zones around MD13, either to donate to Kentucky or to one of the recent house fire disasters that Lions are helping with. Watch for updates.

There are so many wonderful ways that our Lions have been active this Lions year, serving and having fun. Where there is a need, there's a Lion. WE SERVE.
