LCI Service fee of \$35 continues to be waived through June 30. **RETENTION and GROWTH** are keys for each club to focus upon in this final quarter of the Lions Year! We can do this!

Leadership opportunities abound from the District. Club officer elections/ selections are currently underway and a reminder that Club Secretaries are to submit the clubs slate of 2022-2023 officers before May 15, 2022.

Club Excellence Awards recognition from LCI – clubs are reminded that you likely have achieved the qualifications needed to earn Excellence Club status from LCI for the year. I invite you to submit a fillable application form, found on the LCI website. Criteria include: 1) membership; 2) service; 3) leadership and organizational excellence; and 4) marketing & communications. As your District Governor, I am required to sign the club's application. OH1 & OH2 New Voices Workshop will be conducted on Saturday, May 14, 2022, from 9 am to 4:30 pm at the Findlay Hilton Garden Inn. This program is designed to give women Lions a more active voice in Lionism, encourage them in service, in fellowship and in leadership. The application is found on the District OH2 website, with payment information – including an automated PayPal option.

Service continues to excel both locally and for broader global causes for which OH2 clubs and individual Lions have responded overwhelmingly to support! THANK YOU and keep up the good works that you perform as Lions. Some noteworthy service highlights include;

Club Service

Reporting: MD 13 service reporting is #3 nationally. At 73% of clubs have reported service onto the MyLion portal; clubs not reporting include LEO clubs associated with their sponsoring Lions Clubs (accounts for half of remaining clubs not reported). We can achieve 100% service reporting. GST-C Lion Debbie Reidy and

her team have reached out to clubs in the fall and again this spring to assist with service reporting. Thank you clubs that have reported their local service activities. We can do this!

STRIDES Walk for Diabetes Saturday, April 30, 2022 at Mehock Field, 205 W. Cook Rd. Mansfield, OH 44907. Sponsored by the Mansfield United Lions Club, this District endorsed event is for Lions global cause of Diabetes. It is fitting to have two global causes represented with walks: STEPS for childhood cancer in the fall and STRIDES for diabetes awareness in the spring. Kentucky disaster relief, part 2: Due to the overwhelming participation by OH2 clubs in donations to District 43K in January, feedback from locals indicated a need for daily living materials, as communities literally rebuild their homes and lives from the ground up.

The Ohio Lions' Global Service Team plans to collect plastic totes from each Lions district, with items donated within each tote, to transport to Ohio's statewide collection point, in Millersport, OH, for transport to 7 relief locations in western Kentucky that were impacted by the December tornadoes. Ashland Noon Lions

The Ashland Noon club had a busy month with 5 meetings, all well attended with interesting speakers. Our treasurer has begun sending out checks totaling over \$5,000 to local charities from the proceeds of our rose sale. The following historical document was also presented, and copied here for your April 1st entertainment:

A True History of Lion Clubs International Our club historian PCC Stan has long led us to believe that LCI was founded by Melvin Jones in Chicago. In

researching historical documents on LCI, I came across the following scientific paper written in the 1920s which sheds a new light on the origins of the club.

Origin of the Lions Species

By Sir Charley Darwin

It has long been believed that the Lions Club was founded in 1918 by a Chicago businessman (but then don't Americans always claim to be first at everything?) Though extensive research, I have compiled overwhelming evidence of a much older origin and evolution of the club as presented below:

The first evidence of Lionism was documented in the caves of South Africa, dating to prehistoric times. Drawings on the walls clearly depict fierce feline predators, proving these were early Lions clubs. Also among the drawings is evidence of early Lions projects, including scenes of the members hunting mammoths to support the local food bank. Evidence of fire pits, drums and animal bones in the clubhouse indicate the club met regularly, and they talked, they sang, they dined. Speculation is that this was probably on Thursdays

As their ancestors migrated north into Egypt, club grew and a large clubhouse was built in Giza, near Cairo. We now know this as the Sphinx, which contains hidden meeting rooms and passageways. It is thought that membership grew to

hundreds of thousands, and projects included cutting and moving massive blocks of granite and marble to build pyramids and temples for the community to worship. Hieroglyphs show scenes of members playing instruments and carrying food and wine to the clubhouse, supporting the theory that they talked, they sang, they dined. Probably on Thursdays.

When the Romans invaded the land, they took home Lions applications and real lions, and the club became international. Unfortunately, Emperor Nero changed many of the club rules. Initiations became public spectacles with applicants, notably including Daniel, thrown in a pit with the lions. It is believed member retention was poor and club secretaries were kept very busy with necrology reports. It is recorded in club minutes that they cried, prayed, and were dined upon. Probably on Thursdays.

As America was settled and population grew, there were no lions in the land so little thought was given to Lion clubs. Then, in 1918, an Ashland businessman, Merlin Jonas, took his young daughter to a zoo with her classmates. As they watched the lions and heard the fearsome roars, the little girl looked up and said "daddy, would you build us a clubhouse? We could call ourselves the Lions! OH daddy, we could meet every week, we could talk and sing

and dine! We could sow seeds of words and deeds, and all have one great time! Friendship would be our true test! We should probably meet on Thursdays at noon.”

And thus, the first American chapter of LCI was founded in Ashland. Now you know the truth, go forth; talk, sing, dine and spread the word, probably on Thursdays.



Ontario Lions


