Hi Lion Sue, Chief Of Technology LCI/LCIF. Lots of questions on the new system conversion date. Here are some answers (which will be added to the website).

The target conversion timeframe is 7/15/2023 - 7/24/2023, subject to change. To make the conversion we need to wait until after the elections of international officers at LCICon in Boston.

How can clubs help us all stay on track for this date?

 \cdot Get your incoming club officers assigned before 6/15/2023. There are several end of Lion year validations and we need to get as much of this work completed ahead of time.

• Make sure any service activity reporting for events before 6/1/2023 is completed before 6/15/2023. Back reporting after 6/1/2023 – to conversion date events, can be entered in the new system after we make the conversion.

Record any club or above donations to LCIF are in the bank with the appropriate supporting documentation for recognitions before 6/15/2023.

Make sure club data is accurate for this year before 6/15/2023. New members and their sponsors, new clubs formed & members, and any associated transfers and any other end of year activities specific to the club are accurately reflected in MyLion/MyLCI. <end of post

No, I don't know when they will release any "instruction manuals". For now, be sure to check your LCI account to see that everything is ACCURATE, especially your email. If you have a work email account, please consider making a new account outside of work, and maybe just for Lions business. You will not always be able to access that account due to leaving employment, employer closing, retirement, etc.... If you don't have an LCI account, log in now and create one. You will need to know your member number, that's it. THAT EASY. Also check those birthdays. I have seen A LOT of clubs with members born on January 1. I know that isn't correct for 99% of you! We want to be able to get on the new platform when it comes online.

My Fellow Lions,

As we move into February, we can all give a sigh of relief that we made it through the holidays (especially the nice weather we had on Christmas Eve), the new year's celebration and I am sure we are all doing wonderful with our new years resolutions.

Several years ago PDF Kenny Schuck challenged clubs to get a little more healthy and lose some weight as a Diabetes Awareness Project. While my club did not lose much weight, we did have fun with the once a month weigh ins and snack time at meetings even started having more healthy items. Diabetes is a terrible disease that can really effect a person's quality of life. But healthy living now,

every day, can turn back the clock for some of us and bring that dreaded number down next time we have blood work. Here are the latest statistics for diabetes. 37 million people have diabetes. That's about 1 in every 10. Look around your club. If you have 40 people, 4 probably have diabetes. 96 million American, more than 1 in 3 have prediabetes. People who have diabetes have a higher rise of the following serious health complications: Blindness. Stroke. Kidney failure. Heart disease. Loss of toes, feet or legs. So what can you do to prevent diabetes or to move out of the category of prediabetes? Eat healthy. Be more active. Lose weight. Find a partner and start walking. Say no thank you to that cookie or that pie. Let water be your drink of choice. Although there is not a District project anymore, I challenge each club to once again have some programs on Diabetes. Bring in a couple of speakers. Share a healthy recipe each month. Have a weight loss challenge with a prize for the winner. Invite a friend when you have the speakers. Who knows, they may want to become a Lion. In 2022, I visited 29 Lions Clubs. I have two clubs left to visit as 2VDG and then I will begin my visitations with all the southern clubs. That is 29 evenings learning about service projects and fundraisers; getting to know the Lions in these Clubs and what causes are near and dear to their hearts: and 29 evenings of enjoying the hospitality of these clubs. Every one of you have been a joy to visit with and I thank you

for allowing me to crash your meetings and events.

As I have visited clubs, one thing that I have found is Clubs do not have a good understanding of what happens with the money they donate to the District and State Committees. I am putting together a presentation for Leadership School so they can have a better understanding of how their donations are helping those in our State, Country and around the World. I am also going to highlight grants available that the Clubs can submit for to assist with their local projects.

In January visited with the Lindsey Lions on January 9th; Milan Edison Lions on January 10th; and attended Winter Retreat on January 13-15^{th;,} Ι really enjoyed the winter retreat, meeting and visiting with Lions from around the State, as well as OH2. The food was really good and I always enjoy a stay at a State Lodge. I visited with the Buckeye Central Lions on January 20th and will be attending the GMT on January 29th. I have two clubs yet to visit due to illness, with the dates to be determined.

February will a very busy month with COG on February 11th; Cabinet Mtg (which I host) on February 13th, Crestline Club on February 14th, Zone 7 on February 14th, Zone 4 on February 15th, Zone 6 on February 16th, Zone 5th on February 18, Zone 3 on February 20, Zone 2 on February 21st, and Zone 1 on February 23rd. And then we are on to the District Convention. OH2 is on March 17, 18. I will be assisting with the hospitality room at the convention on Friday night. On Saturday, I will be on the lookout for people to become Minions and join in on my demonstration for the election to 1st VDG., so let me know if you want to be a Five Minute Minion. Besides our District convention, I am receiving invitations to the conventions for the other Districts 1-7 and will need to decide which ones I will attend. DISTRICT 13-OH2 CONVENTION DELEGATE REGISTRATION--2023

Dear Club President and or Secretary:

According to the Constitution & By-Laws of Ohio Lions Inc. and the International Association of Lions Clubs, the election of district officers shall be conducted by secret ballot. To insure a secret ballot and that the casting of ballots is done only by authorized delegates, clubs and delegates must comply with the following rules:

1. Each Club is entitled to one (1) delegate for every ten (10) members or major fraction thereof, that have been enrolled in the Club for at least one year and a day as of February 1, 2023. It is the duty of each Club to send a full delegation to the District Convention.

2. All Past District Governors of 13-OH2 shall be considered Delegates-at-Large to this Convention, in addition to the delegate quota of your Club. Any delegate shall have but one vote on each question or issue that is submitted to this Convention.

3. The Club must be in good financial standing with Lions International and District 13-OH2. All dues must be current and merchandise paid for.

4. This form, listing delegates, MUST BE COMPLETED, SIGNED, AND RETURNED to the CABINET SECRETARY by the Club Secretary by March 3, 2023.

5. Each delegate must be a member in good standing with their Club and must pick up, from the Certification Desk, prior to 9:00 AM on March 18, 2023, their authorization to receive a ballot for the business session. It will be necessary for the delegate to present their SIGNED and CURRENT Lion's Member Card.

The Buckeye Bash Friday March 17, 2023; 7:00 p.m. Mid-Ohio Conference Center

As everyone knows, Governor Cindy is a BIG Ohio State Buckeyes fan. So this year we will kick off the OH2 District Convention with a Buckeye Bash. It will be an evening of partying, socializing, hospitality, games and a little entertainment also.

Most everyone who has ever watched an Ohio State football game on television has seen our guest speaker for the evening. With his scarlet face paint, crazy hair and ever present Buckeye necklaces, Larry Lokai aka: The Buckeyeman is a highly recognizable character in the OSU fan base. He is the 2015 NCAA Fan of the Year. To date Buckeyeman has donated over 46,000 buckeye necklaces to special fans, given away 2,000,000 buckeyes either collected or supplied to him plus given fans and students over 1,800 buckeye seedlings and 55 buckeye wreaths.

There is however, much more to Mr. Lokai than just being a super fan. Lokai taught at Northwestern-Clark High School from 1967 to 1989 and was named the Ohio Vocational Teacher of the Year in 1985 while the Northwestern-Clark program was selected as the Outstanding Vocational Agriculture Program in 1988 for Ohio and one of the top six in the nation. In the 1990's he also taught at EHOVE JVS and Keystone High School.

Each year Larry serves as a poultry judge at county fairs and specialty shows with an average of judging 20 shows annually. To date he has been the official poultry judge in 84 of the 88 Ohio county fairs plus shows in California, Michigan, Indiana, Kentucky and Pennsylvania. He served as a 30 year 4-H advisor and a 30 year FFA advisor and has been honored by 15 different FFA Chapters as an Honorary Chapter Farmer, plus won the Honorary American FFA Degree in 1967. Since retiring he has coached students in 20 different FFA chapters special CDE contests focusing on the Poultry CDE and Milk Quality & Product CDE. He is married to Elaine Caldwell-Lokai, has four grown children, 17 grandchildren and 7 great grand children.

Diabetes Dilemma! Problem Solving

As presented in past diabetes articles, diabetes is a chronic health condition requiring the use of "tools" for living well with diabetes to promote healthy blood glucose levels, make healthy lifestyle changes, prevent long-term complications, as well as access and utilize the resources that support a person in diabetes self-management. However, you can follow your treatment plan and still not always get the results that you had anticipated. This can certainly cause a dilemma and knowing how to solve a problem can help.

According to the Association of Diabetes Care and Education Specialists, solving diabetes problems involves 3 steps which include:

STEP 1 - IDENTIFY THE PROBLEM

• What has changed? New medicines? Different food? New job? New work schedule? Change in family situation? New insurance plan?

■ What is going to change? Traveling? Starting exercise? Long meeting scheduled? Holiday celebration? You can develop a plan to prevent problems by knowing what is about to change. Sometimes an unexpected problem occurs that affects your diabetes. In that case, you must pin down the cause and try to solve it. It may not always be clear what will work. A diabetes care and education specialist can guide and support you through this. This takes you to step 2.

STEP 2 - FIND SOLUTIONS

- Think of ways to correct the problem based on your experience, tools and the support you have available.
- Check with your diabetes care and education specialist and healthcare provider to see if you have misunderstood anything about your treatment plan.

• Let them know if your life situation has changed. Work with them to help you decide what plan fits best for you.

- Share any issues you are experiencing, like not being able to afford all your diabetes supplies or medications.
- Ask them for ideas about new tools that could help.
- Having the right information can help you come up with the right solution for your problem. Then you move to step 3.

STEP 3 - TAKE ACTION

• Choose how to solve the problem once you have options.

- Set a realistic action plan.
- Pick a solution that you can handle; get help if you need it.
- Check to make sure your solution choice works.
- Try something different if one solution doesn't help.
