Sales Tax - filed through the Ohio Business Gateway, items sold by Lions (such as calendars, light bulbs, brooms, flowers) are subject to filing every six months: January-June and sales July-December.

Unclaimed Funds- filed through the Ohio Business Gateway and due by November 1. Clubs which do not have unclaimed funds must file a negative unclaimed funds report annually via the OBG.

IRS annual filing- filed electronically through the <u>irs.gov</u> website and is due on or before November 15.

Ohio Attorney General's annual filing - filed on or before November 15 electronically through <u>charitableregistration.ohioattorneygeneral.gov</u>




