Fellow Lions,



Dear Club President and or Secretary:

According to the Constitution & By-Laws of Ohio Lions Inc. and the International Association of Lions Clubs, the election of district officers shall be conducted by secret ballot. To ensure a secret ballot and that the casting of ballots is done only by authorized delegates, clubs and delegates must comply with the following rules:

- 1. Each Club is entitled to one (1) delegate for every ten (10) members or major fraction thereof, that have been enrolled in the Club for at least one year and a day as of February 1, 2024. It is the duty of each Club to send a full delegation to the District Convention.
- 2. All Past District Governors shall be considered Delegates-at-Large to this Convention, in addition to the delegate quota of your Club. Any delegate shall have but one vote on each question or issue that is submitted to this Convention.
- 3. The Club must be in good financial standing with Lions International and District 13 OH2. All dues must be current and merchandise paid for.
- 4. This form, listing delegates, MUST BE COMPLETED, SIGNED, AND RETURNED to the CABINET SECRETARY, by the Club Secretary, on or before March 1st, 2024.
- 5. Each delegate must be a member in good standing with your Club and must pick up his or her authorization to receive a ballot for the business session from the Certification Desk, prior to 12pm April 13, 2024. It will be necessary for the delegate to present his or her SIGNED and CURRENT Lions Membership Card.

January Diabetes News

EXERCISE

When you have type 2 diabetes, daily exercise can be great way to stay healthy. Exercise burns glucose and helps muscle cells respond to insulin. It can even make you happier and help with your sleep. And it doesn't need to be strenuous; 20 minutes a day of moderate-intensity physical activity can make a difference. "As previously recommended, most adults with type 1 or type 2 diabetes should undertake at least 150 min or more of moderate- to vigorous-intensity activity weekly; it is also recommended that these activities occur on at least 3 or more days during the week and that individuals should not allow more than 2 days to elapse between activity sessions to maintain higher levels of insulin sensitivity. However, it is now recognized in this that younger or more physically fit individuals may receive similar cardiovascular and fitness benefits from undertaking vigorous-intensity or high-intensity interval training (HIIT), assuming it adds up to a minimum of 75 min/week."


