The Pitt's are from Chappells, South Carolina and we are looking forward to their participation in our weekend.

We are planning a fun and informative couple of days for you, as well as time for you to socialize and enjoy the company of other Lions from around the district. On Friday evening you can choose to try your luck at Euchre OR you can help judge the Masked Lion Singers.

On Saturday, The Amazing Duck Race takes place at 8:00 AM, Saturday, at the swimming pool. There will be four winners. Proceeds will go to Pediatric Cancer. DISTRICT 13-OH2CONVENTION DELEGATE REGISTRATION--2025

Dear Club President and or Secretary:

According to the Constitution & By-Laws of Ohio Lions Inc. and the International Association of Lions Clubs, the election of district officers shall be conducted by secret ballot. To insure a secret ballot and that the casting of ballots is done only by authorized delegates, clubs and delegates must comply with the following rules:

- 1. Each Club is entitled to one (1) delegate for every ten (10) members or major fraction thereof, that have been enrolled in the Club for at least one year and a day as of February 1, 2025. It is the duty of each Club to send a full delegation to the District Convention.
- 2. All Past District Governors of 13-OH2 shall be considered Delegates-at-Large to this Convention, in addition to the delegate quota of your Club. Any delegate shall have but one vote on each question or issue that is submitted to this Convention.
- 3. The Club must be in good financial standing with Lions International and District 13-OH2. All dues must be current and merchandise paid for.
- 4. This form, listing delegates, MUST BE COMPLETED, SIGNED, AND RETURNED to the CABINET SECRETARY by the Club Secretary by March 3, 2025.
- 5. Each delegate must be a member in good standing with their Club and must pick up, from the Certification Desk, prior to 2:00 PM on March 15, 2025, their authorization to receive a ballot for the business session. It will be necessary for the delegate to present their SIGNED and CURRENT Lion's Member Card.

District Committee's Information



California MD4 Wild Fires

Thank you for your emails of interest and your support for MD 4 with California wildfire relief. I just wanted to let you know that IP Fabricio and LCIF Chairperson Dr. Patti Hill awarded a Major Catastrophe grant for \$100,000 for Multiple District 4 earlier this week. The official award email was just sent to the Lions of MD 4. We have received no further updates yet as it is very early in the process of determining exactly what needs are at this point.

We will continue processing additional Emergency grant requests as they are received.

We also wanted to share some information Lion Manny, MDC of MD 4 shared over the weekend. His email is below. Please feel free to share any and all of this information in your communities.

Dear LCIF Leadership,

I am writing to provide an update on the ongoing disaster relief efforts across California in response to recent wildfires. Attached is the latest Situation Report from Los Angeles County for your reference. Below is a summary of key developments and actions being taken:

1. Disaster Relief Grants

- District 4-L3: Successfully granted a Disaster Relief Grant.
- District 4-L2: Submitted their signed request for an LCIF Disaster Relief Grant.
- District 4-A3: Previously received a Disaster Relief Grant and is consulting with LCIF staff on next steps.
- District 4-A3 is in recovery from a wildfire, though another fire erupted last week. This fire was contained as of January 11, 2025.
- The district remains under a Red Flag Warning from the National Weather Service.

2. Coordinated Statewide Efforts

- On January 12, 2025, MD-4 Council Chair convened a meeting with the full council, including Governors, 1st Vice District Governors (1VDGs), and 2nd Vice District Governors (2VDGs) from all 14 California Districts.
- The council agreed to activate a statewide disaster command and control team to oversee relief efforts.
- Each district is developing specific plans to support Districts 4-L2 and 4-L3 while remaining prepared for future impacts.
- I have been appointed as an adviser to this team to assist in strategic decision-making.

3. Resource Deployment

- Skilled Lions from previous wildfire responses are being mobilized to assist impacted districts.
- Equipment acquired through the LCIF Preparedness Grant, including disaster trailers (photo attached), is being deployed to affected areas.

• Lions are leveraging partnerships with key disaster response organizations, such as the Red Cross and other agencies, to strengthen efforts.

4. Fundraising and Community Contributions

- All districts have initiated LCIF fundraising efforts to support disaster relief operations.
- Donations of physical goods from community members are being coordinated to supplement LCIF grants.
- Lions throughout California are focused on both fundraising and delivering direct service, recognizing the long-term nature of this recovery process.

5. Current Challenges

- Due to continuous fire activity and changing winds, the exact count of destroyed or damaged properties remains uncertain.
- Residents are currently unable to return to their homes, with limited reentry expected by Thursday, January 16, 2025.
- A curfew is in place to prevent looting, enforced by local authorities, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, and 2,500 California National Guard members.
- An additional 1,000 National Guard members have been deployed to assist in the Los Angeles area (Governor's announcement).

Next Steps

- Districts will continue to report progress on their relief and preparedness efforts.
- The statewide disaster command and control team will oversee coordination and provide ongoing updates.
- LCIF's continued support and guidance will be critical as we navigate the complexities of this recovery effort.

We are deeply grateful for LCIF's partnership and support in enabling us to respond effectively to these disasters. The Lions of California remain steadfast in our commitment to serve those in need during this challenging time.





First of all I am thanking all Lions Clubs and members that have donated to LCIF for the California Wild Fires. LCIF is doing as much as possible until they are allowed to get to the communities that as lost everything. There may be Lions members that have lost everything they owned and still will serve others. Ohio is lucky that we have so little disasters but when we do LCIF is there for us.

I be receiving another update from LCIF on grants that have been applied for. The Districts in California will receive several thousands of dollars in grants. MD4 has received \$130,000.00with more to come for the recovery.

All clubs that donates an average of \$30.50 per member will receive the "Horst Herzog Medal". I will need all clubs donations no later than February 15, 2025. I would like to present many medals at the District convention this year.

As of January 10 our District has donated \$17.316.00. Our goal is \$45,956.00, we still need \$28,640.00 to reach our goal.

I will be reaching out to clubs for a visit in the next few weeks. I will be presenting LCIF program at our District Convention in March.




