My motto as I move through the chairs is Be The Light. I believe



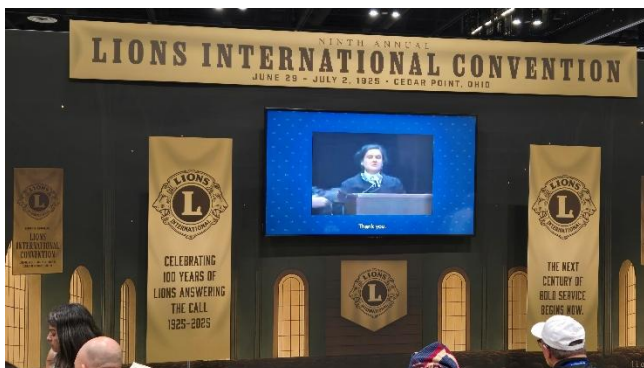

## Ashland Noon Lions Club

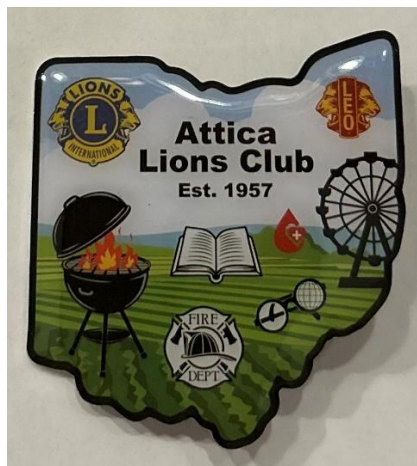
